- Consider the possibility for a trail from the Rattlesnake Mountain trailhead to the Tiger Mountain Highway 18 trailhead.

Raging River State Forest

• Develop a multi-use trail parallel to the river with side trails providing limited access to the river, where appropriate.

We understand that a number of potential trails were suggested by the planning committee during the development of the plan. We would like to see the inclusion of these trails in the plan for future reference.
